I. Catalog Description

Continues DANC 1222. Continues to build the basic fundamentals for the performance and cultural awareness of the regional dances of Spain. Areas of instruction include Andalusian, Folklore, Flamenco, Spanish Classical, and other regional dances. **Prerequisite: DANC 1222. (2:1).**

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course the student will be able to:

- A. Execute movements of Spanish Dance; follow choreographic patterns of authentic Spanish Classical, regional and Flamenco choreography by applying taught principles and technique.
- B. Comprehend historical perspectives, the origin, evolution, and development of traditional Spanish dance; musical accompaniment, costumes, performance production and methods of teaching.
- C. Perceive cultural influences and creative aspects of music and dance styles related to Spain and Latin America, with emphasis on involvement, participation and theory.
- D. Acknowledge the Spain Dance as vital, expressive force in education and in performance.

III. Evaluation

Grades for the course are determined by degree of cooperative participation in class sessions comprehension of assigned reading material, and the final exam.

Final grades are assigned using the following criteria:

Student's individual method of study and practice – 25%

Technical progress – Development of rhythmic skills – 25%

Comprehension of assigned readings – 25% Final Examination-25%
