I. Catalog Description

Provides a basic understanding of variables that affect health sectors in the community. A grade of "C" or better is required in this course to take the next course. **Corequisite: CHLT 1166. (3:0).**

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Discuss the history and general foundations of community and population health.
- B. Design, utilize and plan the strategies necessary to design and implement community needs assessments and health programs using data collecting tools.
- C. Identify factors that affect community health and the leading, trends and needs as they relate to the community through the life span.
- D. Teach culturally appropriate health education and health screening concepts of disease prevention and good mental health through the life span for target populations.
- E. Discuss the role that community based organizations play in community health including services that affect health such as WIC breastfeeding programs and others to assure community access to services.
- F. Identify general strategies for program maintenance, evaluation, job evaluation and evaluation of agency referrals, follow-up and preparation for community outreach.
- G. Define cultural sensitivity and cultural competency.
- H. Participate in skill-building exercises provided by local health agencies to include health promotion competencies in the CHW role such as: assessing, planning implementation, evaluation, coordination, acting as resource and communication.
- I. Design, plan, organize and evaluate training, health presentations, and other activities performed in the community to include competencies such as assessment, coordination and acting as resource.
