Prerequisites: READ 0309 or INRW 0311 or ESOL 0340 (can be taken concurrently) or by placement exam or ENGL 1301 with a "C" or better or ENGL 1302 with a "C" or better. (3:0).

- B. Explain the forms, functions, and characteristics of modern advertising.

- G. Design rough layouts for prints ads.
