I. Catalog Description

Provides the introduction to Linux Operating System. Includes Linux installation, basic administration, utilities and commands, upgrading, networking, security, and application installation. Emphasizes hands-on setup, administration, and management of Linux. (3:1).

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Identify the hardware components that are available on a standard PC.
- B. Reconfigure a hard drive to have partitions available for the installation.
- C. Install Linux on the pre-configured partition.
- D. Configure a boot loader.
- E. Use the basic features of vi, the basic text editor used on Linux systems.
- F. Configure the init process and manage startup scripts.
- G. Configure the system so that it will operate on a LAN with a dedicated IP address.
- H. Configure the system so that it will operate on a LAN with a DHCP provided IP address.
- I. Provide basic security for a system operating on a LAN.
- J. Manage (add, modify, and delete) file systems.
- K. Manage (add, modify, and delete) Users.
- L. Administer optional software packages.

- 1. Install, administer, and manage a Linux system.
- 2. Demonstrate proficiency with Linux utilities, commands, and applications.
- 3. Identify and resolve security-based issues.
