**I. Catalog Description**

Provides rehearsal and performance of contemporary and traditional concert band literature. Open to all brass, woodwind, and percussion instrumentalists with previous experience and music-reading proficiency. Students must provide their own instrument. Three rehearsal hours per week. **Prerequisite: READ 0309 or INRW 0311 or ESOL 0340 (can be taken concurrently) or by placement exam or ENGL 1301 with a “C” or better or ENGL 1302 with a “C” or better. (0:3). Course fee required.**

**II. Course Objectives**

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Participate in public performances of traditional and modern concert band music.
- B. Play concert band music literature in various styles as indicated by the music selected.
- C. Apply the principles and techniques of concert band music.
- D. Demonstrate principles of stage performance and behavior appropriate to concert band music.

**II. Evaluation**

Course evaluation is based on subjective appraisal by the instructor of:

- A. Attendance at and cooperative participation in daily class sessions.
- B. Attendance at and cooperative participation in performances and rehearsals. The student must attend rehearsals and performances.
- C. Application of principles of ensemble performance: intonation, rhythmic accuracy and interpretation.
- D. Application of principles desirable performance and behavior in performances.
- E. The final grade will be determined as follows: Each student is initially assumed to have an “A”. Failure to attend any one public performances or rehearsal for a public performance will lower the letter grade by two letters. Unsatisfactory efforts in any of A, C, or D above will lower the letter grade by one letter.
- F. Since there are no written assignments or formal tests in concert band, a policy on makeup of work is not applicable.

- G. Regular attendance is mandatory. Three unexcused absences will be grounds for being dropped from the course.
