## I. Catalog Description

Continues to offer performance in a wide variety of music in the popular and contemporary idioms. Stresses improvisation techniques and interpreting various jazz styles. Open to woodwind, brass, and rhythm instrumentalists. **Prerequisite: MUEN 2137. (0:3).** 

## II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, the student should develop musical competence in:

- A. Sight read the music used in performances.
- B. Perform the music used in performances with appropriate interpretation.
- C. Demonstrate technical proficiency with the instruments played.
- D. Demonstrate skills in improvisation.
- E. Demonstrate professionalism in performance techniques and self-reliance.

#### III. Evaluation

Course evaluation is based on subjective appraisal by the instructor of:

- A. Attendance at and cooperative participation in performances and rehearsals. The student must attend rehearsals and performances. The schedule of rehearsals and performances is listed in the Instructor's Course Requirements.
- B. Application of principles of instrumental performance.
- C. Application of principles of stage projection and desirable performance behavior in performances.
- D. The final grade will be determined:

  Each student is initially assumed to have an "A". Failure to attend any one public performance or rehearsal for a public performance will lower the letter grade by two letters Unsatisfactory efforts in any of A, C, or D above will lower the grade by one letter.
- E. Since there are no written assignments or formal tests in Jazz Ensemble, a policy on makeup of work is not applicable.
- F. Regular attendance is mandatory. Three unexcused absences will be grounds for being dropped from the course.
