I. Catalog Description

Continues DANC 2349. Continues to offer participation and instruction in Mexican Folk Dance. Includes performance for special occasions on and off-campus. Instructor's Approval. **Prerequisite: DANC 2349.** (3:1).

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course the student will be able to:

- A. Develop a Ballet Folklorico movement vocabulary.
- B. Perform Ballet Folklorico dances in the appropriate style.
- C. Develop rhythmic clarity.
- D. Describe and explain the dances in a historical and social content.
- E. Participate in the creative process and performance and state what is required of a performing artist.
- F. Express an informed opinion on the various dances of Ballet Folklorico.

III. Evaluation

Course evaluation is based on subjective appraisal by the instructor of:

- A. Attendance at and cooperative participation in daily class sessions.
- B. Attendance at and cooperative participation in performances and rehearsals. The student must attend rehearsals and performances.
- C. Application of knowledge of dance steps and principles of dance presentation.
- D. Application of principles of stage projection and desirable performance behavior in performances.
- E. The final grade will be determined:
 - Each student is initially assumed to have an "A".
 - Failure to attend any one public performance or rehearsal for a public performance will lower the letter grade by two letters. Unsatisfactory efforts in any of A, C, or D above will lower the letter grade by one letter.
- F. Since there are no written assignments or formal tests in Chorus, a policy on makeup of work is not applicable.
- G. Regular attendance is mandatory. Three unexcused absences will be grounds for being dropped from the course.
