**I. Catalog Description**

Continues to train students in popular, classical, and contemporary ensemble music presentation. Choral techniques and group vocal placement, breathing, and diction are taught. **Prerequisite: MUEN 2141. (0:3).**

**II. Course Objectives**

Upon satisfactory completion of this course the student will be able to:

- A. Participate in public performances of popular, classical and contemporary choral music.
- B. Sing choral music literature in English, Spanish, Latin and other languages as indicated by the music selected.
- C. Apply the principles and techniques of individual and group vocal placement, breathing and diction .
- D. Apply principles of stage projection and performance behavior.

**III. Evaluation**

Course evaluation is based on subjective appraisal by the instructor of:

- A. Attendance at and cooperative participation in daily class sessions.
- B. Attendance at and cooperative participation in performances and rehearsals.  
 The student must attend rehearsals and performances. The schedule of rehearsals and performances is listed in the Instructor’s Course Requirements.
- C. Application of principles of vocal placement, breathing and diction.
- D. Application of principles of stage projection and desirable performance behavior in performances
- E. The final grade will be determined:  
 Each student is initially assumed to have an "A". Failure to attend any one public performance or rehearsal for a public performance will lower the letter grade by two letters Unsatisfactory efforts in any of A, C, or D above will lower the letter grade by one letter.
- F. Since there are no written assignments or formal tests in Chorus, a policy on makeup of work is not applicable.
- G. Regular attendance in mandatory. Three unexcused absences will be grounds for being dropped from the course.
