Provides graphics, text, sound, animation and\or video that may be used in presentation development. This is a Microsoft Official Academic Course (MOAC) program that prepares students to take the Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) certification exam. The MOS exam is a global certification that validates students' skills. To be certified, the exam must be taken from a third-party testing company. (2:1).
