**I. Course Description**

Introduces welding of pipe using the shielded metal arc welding process (SMAW), including electrode selection, equipment setup, and safe shop practices. Emphasizes weld positions 1G and 2G using various electrodes. **Corequisite: WLDG 2451. (3:3). Lab Fee.**

**II. Course Objectives**

- a. Describe equipment and safe shop practices
- b. Demonstrate required pipe preparation
- c. Perform 1G and 2G welds using various electrodes

**III. THECB Learning Outcomes (WECM)**

- 1. Describe equipment and required pipe preparation.
- 2. Perform 1G and 2G welds using various electrodes.

**IV. Evaluation**

The knowledge and skills stated in the objective must be demonstrated by the students in the form of tests and assignments in order to complete the course. Test (50%) and lab assignments (50%) will be averaged, letter grades will be arranged as follows:
