I. Catalog Description

Discusses the theory and practice with drafting methods and the terminology required to prepare working drawings in various occupational fields. (3:3).

- C. Create a multi-view drawing of an object
- D. Create free-hand sketches of a project
- E. Construct a drawing using dimension lines
- F. Demonstrate the correct use of measuring instruments
- G. Interpret drawings correctly
- H. Identify blueprint symbols
- I. Interpret scales
- J. Identify section views
- K. Interpret title block
- L. Interpret electrical, electronic, mechanical, HVAC, and plumbing blueprints correctly
- M. Interpret structural blueprints
- N. Modify existing blueprints
- O. Perform GD and T (geometric dimensioning and tolerancing)
