I. Catalog Description

Provides a foundation in the enjoyment and understanding of music through the use of recorded music and song literature. Examines elements of music and analysis of music form and design in relation to other subjects and activities. **Prerequisite: INRW 0311 or ESOL 0340 (can be taken concurrently) or by placement exam or ENGL 1301 with a "C" or better or ENGL 1302 with a "C" or better. (3:0).**

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Aurally recognize the basic elements of listening (melody, harmony, rhythm, form, and tone color).
- B. Describe characteristics of each of the major periods in the history of western art music.
- C. Discuss important composers and their works.
- D. Discuss the development of music and its relationship to other arts and historical events.

III. Evaluation

- A. Tests will be given to determine the student's progress and understanding of the course material. A minimum of three exams and a final exam will be administered.
- B. Homework and reading assignments may be given by the instructor to aid the student in learning the course material. Students will be required to complete at least two concert reports during the semester.
- C. To determine the student's final grade, the instructor will average test scores and assignments. Grades will be based on the following scale:
 - 90 to 100 = A
 - 80 to 89 = B
 - 70 to 79 = C
 - 60 to 69 = D
 - Below 60 = F
- D. Attendance requirements will be specified by the instructor and may be a factor in determining the final grade.
