I. Catalog Description

Provides the student a weekly performance opportunity before an audience of peers, as well as exposure to diverse repertoire performed by other students. This course may be repeated. Required of Music Majors. Graded on a Pass/Fail basis.

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Demonstrate proper planning and preparation for a public musical performance as a soloist and/or ensemble member.
- B. Perform with enhanced musicianship skills, to include selection of appropriate repertoire, appearance, poise, articulation, phrasing, and use of dynamics.
- C. Demonstrate good concert etiquette in a formal setting.
- D. Develop a musical repertoire covering a wide range of styles, historical periods, and composers.

III. Evaluation

This course is graded on a Pass/Fail basis. In order to pass the course, the following requirements must be met:

- A. Music Majors must perform on at least two class session recital programs during the semester.
- B. No more than three absences are allowed. Absence make up policy will be specified by the instructor.
