I. Catalog Description

The course is a Non-Course Based Option for students enrolled in Math 0305 Emporium course. This course covers exponential and logarithmic expressions and functions. **Prerequisite: Completed all material leading up to week 13 in Math 0305 during the semester of enrollment.**

II. Course Objectives

- A. Unit I. Exponential and Logarithmic Functions
 - 1. Recognize the one-to-oneness of functions and inverse functions.
 - 2. Evaluate exponential and logarithmic functions.
 - 3. Graph exponential and logarithmic functions.
 - 4. Explain the inverse relationship of exponential and logarithmic functions.
- B. Unit II. Review of Math 0305 Topics
 - 1. Solve equations by factoring.
 - 2. Identify, evaluate, simplify, and solve rational expressions and functions.
 - 3. Simplify, rationalize, evaluate, and solve equations containing complex numbers and radical expressions.
 - 4. Evaluate, solve, and graph quadratic equations, functions, and non-linear inequalities.

III. Evaluation

- A. Students will be assessed on Unit I and given a comprehensive final exam.
- B. The course grade will be assigned based on the following scale: P (Pass)....100-70NP (No Pass)...Below 69
