I. Catalog Description

Studies the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations pertinent to the construction industry. (3:0).

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course the student will be able to:

- A. Explain the OSHA act and general duty clause
- B. Identify employer and employee rights and responsibilities under OSHA
- C. Describe inspections, citations, and penalties under OSHA
- D. Identify its general safety and health provisions
- E. Recognize the value of safety and health
- F. Use the OSHA website and available resources
- G. Focus on four hazards
 - a. Fall protection, sub-point M
 - b. Electrical, sub-point K
 - c. Falling objects, trucks, cranes, and construction masonry
 - d. Trend hazards, ungrounded machinery, and equipment
- H. Identify health hazards

III. THECB Learning Outcomes (WECM)

- 1. Identify the OSHA regulations which apply to the construction industry.
- 2. Demonstrate proficiency in retrieving specific information from Title 29 C.F.R. Part 1926 regulations.

IV. Evaluation
