#### I. Catalog Description

Provides a study of the requirements of building electrical systems, fire codes, lighting distribution, power sources, alarm systems, and interior and exterior communication. **Prerequisite: ENTC 2414. (3:3). Lab fee.** 

## II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Practice the basic safety procedures for working on electrical systems.
- B. Identify electrical system components.
- C. Describe and maintain alarm and communication systems.
- D. Define the project requirements from contract documents.
- E. Determine the required number of branch circuits for a set of loads.
- F. Determine the correct rating branch circuit loads and the preferred type of wire and size of the conductor for the branch circuit.
- G. Select the switches, receptacles, and raceways for the branch circuits.
- H. Determine the branch circuits for appliance and utilization equipment.
- I. Maintain emergency power system.
- J. Describe the basic structure of data, voice, and video system.
- K. Identify NEC requirements.

## III. THECB Learning Outcomes (WECM)

- 1. Evaluate electrical system components.
- 2. Evaluate alarm and communication system components.
- 3. Operate a computer-aided facility management system.
