### I. Catalog Description

Continues the study, methodology, and production of architectural drawings. Explores the techniques available for the design process with emphasis on three-dimensional composition both analog and digital.  
**Prerequisites: ARCH 1307. (2:4). Lab fee.**

### II. Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- A. Use Three-Dimensional Digital Modeling in various platforms with further exploration of software capabilities.
- B. Investigate color theory and utilize color effectively in design through various analog and digital media.
- C. Use shade and shadow techniques effectively in design; student will have an overall understanding of design orientation and light source.
- D. Create drawings that demonstrate an understanding of design processes and further explore various ways to represent design concepts through various ordering principles.
- E. Compare and interpret the relationship between analog and digital techniques.
- F. Utilize various digital media to create presentations for target audiences within the profession and the general public; select appropriate media techniques for greatest emotional and artistic impact.
- G. Develop a comprehensive design presentation, including plans, elevations, sections, axonometric, perspectives, and appropriate graphics to communicate schematic and design decisions.
- H. Master digital imaging software through graphic design principles and architectural representation and produce quality images and publications suitable for portfolios.
