I. Catalog Description

Provides individual instruction for the non-music major or an entering music major needing remedial work on guitar instruments. This course is available when the principal instrument is in the guitar family. Provides one half-hour lesson per week. **(1:0)**.

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course the student will be able to:

- A. Demonstrate the use of proper fingering and hand position through playing major scales and arpeggiated chords two octaves or more.
- B. A performance for Introduction to Individual Instruction in Guitar Instrument I is not required for this semester but if the student chooses to perform they can perform on a studio recital. Juries are also not required.
- C. Demonstrate a basic understanding of music symbols such as pitches on the staff, rhythms, and terminology.

III. Evaluation

- A. Student evaluation will be based on the appraisal by the instructor of student progress during the semester as shown in:
 - 1. The student's progress on their etudes, scale studies, and repertoire.
- B. The course grade as determined above will be reduced one letter for excessive absences in lessons.
