I. Catalog Description

A foundation studio course exploring drawing with emphasis on descriptive, expressive and conceptual approaches. Students will learn to see and interpret a variety of subjects while using diverse materials and techniques. Coursework will facilitate a dialogue in which students will engage in critical analysis and begin to develop their understanding of drawing as a discipline. May include life drawing using a nude model. **(2:4). Lab fee.**

II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- A. Analyze and represent a variety of subjects including basic geometric forms, still-life subjects, and the natural world.
- B. Analyze and represent a three-dimensional form onto a two-dimensional surface using measurement and comparison. Analyze and represent the effects of light and shadow as a means of expressing three-dimensional space and form on a two-dimensional surface. Demonstrate linear, one-point and two-point perspective as observable representations of visual space.
- C. Use critical thinking skills to evaluate visual content in a group and/or individual classroom setting.
- D. Through creative and critical thinking, apply suitable drawing media towards visual expression of the observed world.
- E. (Optional) Understand basic anatomy and be able to draw the human figure in contour and gesture working from a live nude model.

III. THECB Learning Outcomes (ACGM)

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

1. Describe visual subjects through the use of accurate and sensitive observation.
2. Generate drawings which demonstrate descriptive, expressive, and conceptual approaches.
3. Utilize varied materials and techniques with informed aesthetic and conceptual strategies.
4. Demonstrate an appropriate level of professional practice, including safety, craft and presentation.
5. Analyze and critique drawings verbally and/or in writing.
6. Relate drawing to design, art history and contemporary artistic production.

C. Post-assessment

Each student’s grade will be determined by the instructor upon successful completion of the course objectives. Instructors will maintain adequate records of student progress according to the guidelines established by the college.
