### I. Catalog Description

Studio art course that introduces the analytic study of the human form and the figure's potential for compositional and expressive use in drawing. Emphasizes anatomical structure and composition of the figure through the use of drawing media and study of a nude model. **Prerequisite: ARTS 1316. (2:4). Lab fee.**

### II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- A. Visually present and communicate understanding of the human figure in terms of anatomy, though the study of skeletal and muscular structures.
- B. Analyze the human figure though the use of plastic form after having understood basic structure through comprehension of anatomy.
- C. Experiment with composition, materials, and techniques using analytic structure of the human figure as a basis for resolution of studio problems.

### III. THECB Learning Outcomes (ACGM)

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

1. Describe the human figure using accurate and sensitive observation.
2. Articulate the relationship between aesthetics and anatomy.
3. Generate drawings that demonstrate descriptive, expressive, and conceptual approaches using varied materials and techniques within assigned parameters.
4. Relate their drawings to historical and contemporary developments in the field.
5. Analyze and critique drawings verbally and/or in writing.
6. Demonstrate an appropriate level of professional practice, including safety, craft, and presentation.

### IV. Evaluation

- A. Pre-assessment

Instructor should check each student's prerequisites the first week of class; those who do not qualify should be sent back to Admissions.

**B. Challenge Exam**

There is no challenge exam for this course.

**C. Postassessment**

Each student's grade will be determined by the instructor upon successful completion of the course objectives.

**D. Remediation**

Remediation will be determined by the individual instructor. During this time the student is encouraged to seek the advice of the instructor. Remedial work or study will not be in place of regular open studio or outside study/practice activities.
