### I. Catalog Description

An overview of the fundamental skills and knowledge necessary for the field of nail technology.

**Prerequisites: CSME 1505 and CSME 1443. (2:5). Lab fee. Professional Practice Insurance required.**

### II. Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of this course the student will be able to:

- A. Demonstrate professionalism during client consultation and services including safety and sanitation measures.
- B. Define the chemicals, tools, and supplies used in artificial nail enhancement services.
- C. Perform connect tip sizing and application.
- D. Demonstrate acrylic overlay using appropriate mix ratio, bead placement, and filing/finishing techniques.
- E. Successfully complete the course final.

### III. THECB Learning Outcomes (WECM)

1. Demonstrate nail technology skills.
2. Practice safety and sanitation and sterilization according to the laws and rules of the state licensing agency.
3. Practice professional ethics.

### IV. Evaluation

#### Grading Criteria

**The overall semester grade is evaluated 50% lecture and 50% lab work.**

- A. Students are assigned theory study and a minimum number of lesson activities which are required for course completion. Theory (lecture) which counts for 50% of the course grade is evaluated in two separate segments.

25% **Exams:** consist of exams and quizzes at the end of each unit of study

25% **Interactive Demos:** consist of class participation and lesson activities

Students are assigned practical experiences (lab) which count 50% of the course grade is evaluated in two separate segments.

25% **General Lab**: consists of completing all general lab assignments.

25% **Lecture Specific Lab**: consists of lab assignments following demonstration lectures in a class setting.

Practical skills are evaluated according to State requirements or instructors procedures. The Texas Department of Licensing & Regulations (TDLR) establishes practical performance standards.
