CTE Six-Year Plans (Recommended Graduation Plan)

The CTE Six-Year Plans are living documents and subject to change at any time within each individual ISD's articulation agreements and EPCC's program degree plans and courses.

The following is specific information regarding the use of the CTE Six-Year Plans for a better and clearer understanding of their purpose and function.

COLLEGE

- El Paso Community College (EPCC)

LOGOS

- The *Achieve Texas*, *El Paso Community College* and *TEXASgenuine* logos are linked to their respective Web page
- Click where indicated and the Internet site will be accessed

PROGRAM/CIP CODES

- The Program Code represents the EPCC program code
- The Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) Code is the code designated for use by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board through the U.S. Department of Education

PLAN

- The name of the particular college degree plan
- Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.)
- Certificates of Completion – *Cert 1: 15-42 hours; Cert 2: 30-51 hours; Cert 3: 6-12 hours*
- See College Catalog for more information

ISD/CISD

- The name of the independent school district (ISD) in the plan

CAREER CLUSTER

- One of Texas' 16 career clusters based on those developed by the U.S. Department of Education
- The respective career cluster logo is also shown and is for informational purposes

CAREER PATHWAY

- The career pathway designated through each career cluster which assigns the path of each plan for completing the career goal

ONETONLINE.ORG LINK

- An active link, www.onetonline.org, designed to take the user to the appropriate career pathway and information materials on the Internet
- The code number identifies the detailed information of that particular career path
- The Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) is the number assigned to a particular occupation
- In some instances, the code number is the closest link to occupations requirements

HIGH SCHOOL/SECONDARY VS COLLEGE/POSTSECONDARY

- High School/Secondary shows the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) requirements used by the ISDs
- College/Postsecondary shows the specific program degree plan either for an Associate of Applied Science Degree or Certificate of Completion

COLOR CODING

- The **RED** indicates the articulated course name, length of semester and Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) number for the secondary with a comment in "bold black" for the corresponding postsecondary course
- **RED** is shown in both secondary and postsecondary to indicate the correlation between the two parts of the matrix
- A **CIP** code is also in **red** on the postsecondary to indicate the appropriate identification of the secondary and postsecondary numbering systems

- Indicate the number of possible articulated college credits that can be earned while in high school
