**DEVELOPMENT EDUCATION OPTIONS:** At EPCC, some students need to take developmental courses in Reading, Writing, Math, and/or ESOL based on their placement scores. Designed to prepare students for their college level courses, developmental courses are also offered in accelerated formats to help students reach this level faster. There are many support services available to help students succeed on their developmental paths. Students should enroll in any required developmental coursework their first semester in order to meet college course requirements and not delay degree completion. **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:** The two-year Associate of Applied Science degree in Child Development prepares students for positions in child care facilities and Head Start programs. An Associate of Applied Science degree is awarded upon completion of the program. Students who successfully complete the Child Development Associate Credential may apply for transfer credit of up to fifteen (15) semester hours in the core curriculum of the Child Development Associate of Applied Science degree. A criminal background check is required of all students in the program. Students should contact the Child Development faculty for more information.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES: Graduates of this program are qualified to work with infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and school-aged children, including children with special needs. Students must successfully complete the Child Development Core Curriculum in addition to the courses listed below. The capstone courses for AAS degree in Child Development is CDEC 2384, Cooperative Education-Child Development I. Upon completion of the AAS degree in Child Development, students are qualified to open a home care program, work for a child care program, or enter as a teacher assistant in the Head Start program. Graduates of the AAS degree in Child Development may apply for paraprofessional positions in any of the Independent School Districts in the EI Paso-Hudspeth Counties. Depending on the position a student assumes in an early childhood or social service program, the earnings may start at \$8.50/hour to an annual salary of \$40,000. In many of the programs in EI Paso, students whom earn higher degrees may earn an annual salary of \$40,000 or higher. Home care providers could presumably be able to earn up to \$5,000 a month, depending on the level of care and the ages of the children in the program.

**PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:** CDEC 2384 is a capstone course, and is offered every semester. Students must complete 240 hours in an early childhood program as an intern. Placement for the internship is coordinated between the Child Development Program and Early Childhood Programs in the El Paso County.
