

- ❖ EPCC is #1 in the country for awarding the most degrees to Hispanic students for the 15th year in a row according to The Hispanic Outlook on Education publication.
- ❖ For the 8th year in a row, EPCC has won the Higher Education Excellence in Diversity (HEED) Award from *INSIGHT Into Diversity* magazine, the oldest and largest diversity-focused publication in higher education.
- ❖ The Department of Education TRIO Programs awarded a \$707,647 federal grant to El Paso Community College (EPCC) for the Student Support Services Program (SSSP), which is the largest award in Texas and the eighth largest in the nation. This grant will provide academic and support services to a diverse group of students encouraging them on their way to graduation.
- ❖ EPCC held a grand opening of a new building at the Northwest campus. The new building will provide an innovative space to further enhance the learning experience of the students.
- ❖ EPCC earned Gold designation on the 2020-2021 Military Friendly School list by VIQTORY media. The Military Friendly® Schools list has come to set the standard for higher education institutions to provide the best opportunities for veterans and their spouses.
- ❖ EPCC's Welding and Machining Technology programs at the Valle Verde campus received a \$167,000 grant from Marathon Petroleum that will fund the latest equipment to train students in these high-demand fields.
- McDonald's El Paso partnered with the EPCC Foundation to match funds and make \$46,000 available to graduating high school students to attend EPCC. Students were selected based on their academic achievements, community involvement, and overall drive and commitment to pursue higher education.
- Assistant Professor of English and Creative Writing, Yasmín Ramírez, was awarded the first 2020 Woody and Gayle Hunt Aspen Institute Fellowship. The fellowship provides funding to residents of the Borderplex region who are admitted to an Aspen Institute program based on their personal and professional expertise.



The Best Place to Start and Finish!

- ❖ EPCC's Career and Technical Education (CTE) Division and the Socorro Independent School District have partnered together to create the Americas High School Libertas Academy which gives students the opportunity to earn an associate degree in court reporting by the time they graduate from high school.
- ❖ EPCC and the Ysleta Independent School District held a grand opening for the Career Center at Riverside Pathways in Technology Early College High School at the Valle Verde Transportation Training Center. The collaboration focuses on career and technical education areas like Automotive Technology, Diesel Technology and Computer aided Design.
- ❖ EPCC's BRIDGES program (EPCC-UTEP) was selected as one of 30 finalists for the Bellwether Awards from the Bellwether College Consortium. The BRIDGES program trains research-oriented minority (primarily Mexican-American) undergraduate students who bridge from the community college into the university and complete baccalaureate degrees in biomedical fields. The award is given to institutions with the most innovative and exemplary programs.
- ❖ Dean Joshua Villalobos and the Geology Program were featured in an article published by Eos, the Science News publication of the American Geophysical Union, for the groundbreaking work he's done to provide access and opportunities for students in geoscience careers. As such, EPCC has emerged as a model for other 2-year institutions looking to recruit and prepare the next generation of geoscientists.
- ❖ EPCC held a virtual commencement ceremony to celebrate the Class of 2020 which included 4,070 graduates from the spring, summer and fall semesters.
- ❖ EPCC's Men's Half Marathon team was named the national Top Academic Team of the Year for Half Marathon for the third year in a row by the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA). The EPCC men earned a combined grade point average (GPA) of 3.68.







Total Hispanic Population as of July 1, 2019







Percent of Persons 25 and Older with an Associate's, Bachelor's, or Graduate/Professional Degree, 2015-2019








Degrees and Certificates Awarded, 1972-2020






Enrollment of Students at Each Location, Fall 2020



Enrollment by Student Type, Fall 2020











Top 10 Majors of First-Time in College Students, Fall 2020





Enrollment of Military Affiliated Students, by Gender, Fall 2020














Enrollment of Military Affiliated Students by Full and Part-Time Status, Fall 2020










Dual Credit Enrollment by Gender, Fall 2020




Dual Credit Enrollment by Ethnicity, Fall 2020



Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board: 2020 Graduation Rates within 3, 4 and 6 Years, by Full and Part-Time Status







GLOSSARY

Cohort: A group of individuals who meet a set of criteria (e.g., a group of students who register during the same semester or begin attending college for the first time at the same time).

Developmental Student: A student who takes a developmental course during his or her first semester in college (State definition). This designation is permanent with respect to the student's State record.

Face-to-Face Course: The traditional delivery method in which a courses is taught in a face-to-face setting with an instructor.

Fall-to-Fall Retention: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following fall semester.

Fall-to-Spring Persistence: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following spring semester.

First-Time In College (FTIC) Student: A student in his or her first semester of college attendance, who has never attended any college previously.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE): The total number of student credit hours divided by 15 for the Fall term (or for one semester only) and is divided by 30 for the entire academic or fiscal year.

Full-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 12 or more credit hours during any semester.

Internet Course: A type of delivery method in which a course is taught online and allows students access to course materials 24 hours a day. Faculty post materials, instructions, readings and assignments online for students to complete on their own or in a group.

Part-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 11 credit hours or less during any semester.

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB): This agency was created by the Texas Legislature and provides leadership and coordination for the Texas higher education system and works with the legislature, governor, governing boards, higher education institutions and other entities to help promote access to quality higher education across Texas.

Unduplicated Enrollment: The number of students registered during a specified period of time.

V2019: aka Vintage Year 2019. The final year of data produced in a time series of estimates of population that begins with the most recent decennial U.S. Census data and extends to the "Vintage Year." V2019 is the most current year of population estimates available as of July 1, 2020.
