❖ EPCC Named 2021 HEED Award Winner for 9th Consecutive Year

For the 9th year in a row, EPCC received the 2021 Higher Education Excellence in Diversity (HEED) Award from *INSIGHT Into Diversity* magazine, the oldest and largest diversity-focused publication in higher education. The annual HEED Award is a national honor recognizing U.S. colleges and universities that demonstrate an outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion.

❖ EPCC Receives \$30 Million Donation from MacKenzie Scott

EPCC is one institution chosen by Scott and husband Dan Jewett to receive a portion of the \$2.7 billion in charitable gifts. These funds will allow to dramatically expand services, helping more people in the community find the path to their best lives through EPCC. These funds will be used to empower students and transform their lives through education.

EPCC Earns Military Friendly National Designation

EPCC was recognized with a 2021-2022 Military Friendly® School Silver designation by VIQTORY. Now in its 11th year, the Military Friendly® Schools list has come to set the standard for higher education institutions to provide the best opportunities for veterans and their spouses.

❖ Federal Funding Erases Some Student Debt

More than \$3 million of debt students owed to EPCC was cleared for students using federal Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF). EPCC's New Beginnings Program eliminated outstanding balances for around 4,700 students who were enrolled during the pandemic in Spring, Summer, and Fall of 2020 and the Spring of 2021.

Student-Parent Succeeds with Support from Child Care Grant

EPCC received \$1 million from the "Child Care Access Means Parents in School" (CCAMPIS) grant. The grant helps subsidize childcare for qualifying parents while they're in classes at EPCC. The grant is in collaboration with the YWCA in supporting student parents. EPCC works hard to identify needs and deliver the supports that will help student parents be successful.

❖ Aid for Books & Other Expenses

Additional funds for students enrolled in the Fall 2021 semester were made available as part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). Students were eligible for an additional \$500 for books and supplies—part-time students qualified for up to \$1,250 and full-time students for up to \$1,500 in ARPA funding.

❖ New MDP Building Provides Innovative Learning Opportunities

EPCC officially opened the doors to a new building located in far East El Paso at the Mission del Paso (MDP) campus in November 2021, and celebrated with a grand opening celebration. The MDP Campus is the college's fastest-growing campus. The state-of-the-art facility at MDP offers 60,000 additional square feet of classrooms, labs, and a "flexitorium space" accommodating lectures, performances, and guest speakers.

Faith Nyathi Named Women's Cross-County Athlete of the Year

Faith Nyathi was named as the Women's Cross-Country Athlete of the Year by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross-Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA).

Dr. Servin Receives National Award

Dr. Christian Servin, Associate Professor of Computer Science at El Paso Community College (EPCC) was awarded a 2021 Hispanic Engineer National Achievement Awards Corporation (HENAAC) Award during the virtual Great Minds in STEM (GMiS) Annual Conference. The award was in the category of Most Promising Engineer-Education.

EPCC students conducted research and gained scientific experience inside and outside the classroom. Rise to the Challenge Bridge Program student Gloria Sepulveda was recently awarded for her e-poster presentation at the 2021 Annual Biomedical Research Conference for Minority Students (ABRCMS).







Total Hispanic Population as of July 1, 2021







Per capita income (in 2020 dollars), 2016-2020















Enrollment of Students at each Location, Fall 2021





Enrollment by Student Type, Fall 2021





Enrollment by Students Receiving any Financial Aid, Fall 2021














FIRST-TIME IN COLLEGE STUDENTS RETENTION AND PERSISTENCE




Top 10 Majors of First-Time in College Students, Fall 2021






Military Affiliated Student Enrollment, Fall 2021


















Dual Credit Enrollment by Ethnicity, Fall 2021



Early College High School Enrollment, by Ethnicity, Fall 2021



Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board: 2021 Graduation Rates within 3, 4 and 6 Years, by Full and Part-Time Status







Continuing Education Enrollment by Ethnicity, Quarter 1, Fall 2021



GLOSSARY

Cohort: A group of individuals who meet a set of criteria (e.g., a group of students who register during the same semester or begin attending college for the first time at the same time).

Developmental Student: A student who takes a developmental course during his or her first semester in college (State definition). This designation is permanent with respect to the student's State record.

Face-to-Face Course: The traditional delivery method in which a course is taught in a face-to-face setting with an instructor.

Fall-to-Fall Retention: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following fall semester.

Fall-to-Spring Persistence: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following spring semester.

First-Time In College (FTIC) Student: A student in his or her first semester of college attendance, who has never attended any college previously.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE): The total number of student credit hours divided by 15 for the Fall term (or for one semester only) and is divided by 30 for the entire academic or fiscal year.

Full-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 12 or more credit hours during any semester.

Internet Course: A type of delivery method in which a course is taught online and allows students access to course materials 24 hours a day. Faculty post materials, instructions, readings and assignments online for students to complete on their own or in a group.

Part-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 11 credit hours or less during any semester.

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB): This agency was created by the Texas Legislature and provides leadership and coordination for the Texas higher education system and works with the legislature, governor, governing boards, higher education institutions and other entities to help promote access to quality higher education across Texas.


Unduplicated Enrollment: The number of students registered during a specified period of time.

V2021: aka Vintage Year 2021. The final year of data produced in a time series of estimates of population that begins with the most recent decennial U.S. Census data and extends to the "Vintage Year." V2021 is the most current year of population estimates available as of July 1, 2022.
