



The Best Place to Start and Finish!

First-Year Experience is Finalist for Bellwether Award (Nov 2022)

EPCC was selected as 1 of 30 finalists by The Bellwether College Consortium for the highly coveted *Bellwether Awards*. Bellwether finalists represent leading community colleges whose outstanding and innovative programs and practices were selected among competitive submissions as exemplary. The finalists underwent a rigorous second and final round of review at the 2023 Community College Futures Assembly in February 2023. EPCC's First-Year Experience (FYE)

has been recognized with this honor. FYE specializes in academic coaching and advising for First-Time in College (FTIC) students.

EPCC Architecture Honored by Texas Society of Architects (Oct 2022)

EPCC Architecture students and faculty participated in the Texas Society of Architects Convention held in El Paso. The EPCC Architecture discipline was honored to be chosen to present an installation at the entrance to the conference. The installation, titled *Ofrenda Tectónica*, was designed to honor the traditions of a Día de los Muertos alter. This was all done in partnership with students and faculty of the EPCC Art and Technology Disciplines along with the help of the EPCC Makerspace.

EPCC Named HEED Award Recipient; 10th Year in a Row (Sep 2022)

EPCC received the 2022 *Higher Education Excellence in Diversity (HEED) Award* from INSIGHT Into Diversity magazine, the oldest and largest diversity-focused publication in higher education. As a recipient of the annual HEED Award — a national honor recognizing U.S. colleges and universities that demonstrate an outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion — EPCC was featured, along with 102 other recipients, in the November 2022 issue of INSIGHT Into Diversity magazine. This was the 10th year in a row EPCC has been named a HEED Award recipient. INSIGHT Into Diversity magazine selected EPCC because of its work to foster and promote cultural awareness and respect not only among employees but also among our students and the surrounding El Paso community.

EPCC Nationally Recognized for Student Success (Feb 2022)

For the 17th year in a row, EPCC has been recognized as a leader in education to Hispanic students by the *Hispanic Outlook on Education* magazine. In the February 2022 issue, EPCC was highlighted on the cover and had an article on its success along with an interview with EPCC President, Dr. William Serrata. EPCC had the distinction of being one of the nation's leaders in associate's degrees granted and Hispanic enrollment.

Former Tejanos Inducted into EP Baseball Hall of Fame (Aug 2022)

Former El Paso Community College Tejanos, Rick Solis and Kyle Anson, were inducted into the *El Paso Baseball Hall of Fame* in September 2022. Rick Solis played for the Tejanos in 1999 and 2000. He went on to play at Northwestern State University in 2001 and 2002. He played one season in the Los Angeles Dodgers' minor league system. Solis is now the Head Coach of the Riverside Rangers. Kyle Anson played for the Tejanos in 2002 and 2003. He finished his college career with Texas State University in 2004 and 2005. He played four seasons in the New York Yankees' minor league system. The inductees threw out the ceremonial first pitch in September 2022 at the El Paso Chihuahuas baseball game followed by the Induction Ceremony the following day.

❖ EPCC Joins Grow with Google's HSI Career Readiness Program (Jul 2022)

EPCC announced its participation in the *Grow with Google HSI Career Readiness Program.* The initiative will help Latino students at 35 Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs) prepare for the workforce through digital skills training and career workshops. Through a \$2 million investment in the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU), the program will train 200,000 Latino students by 2025.

❖ EPCC Testing Center Recognized as a Worldwide Leader (Jun 2022)

EPCC High School Equivalency Testing Center (HSETC) was recognized as one of the Most Innovative Pearson VUE Test Centers, receiving the Prosper 2022 PVTC Summit Award. As there are over 5,000 testing centers in over 180 countries, Pearson Vue Test Centers awarded EPCC along with several others from around the world. "I take a lot of pride in my job and feel richly rewarded when someone of the stature like Pearson Vue acknowledges the job we do. I would not be able to do the job of this capacity if it wasn't for the EPCC HSE Testing Services Staff," said Cynthia Compean, High School Equivalency Testing Services Manager.

EPCC Computer Science Students Win National Competition (Oct 2022)

EPCC Computer Science students won 1st, 2nd and Honorable Mention at the Great Minds in STEM (GMiS) National Conference in Pasadena, California. EPCC is the first community college to ever win this prestigious national competition after students participated in the Data Analytics and Machine Learning competition. EPCC teams received Honorable Mention for the CAHSI Hackathon for the Password Hacking track, competing against 100 teams.

Marathon Petroleum Presents Grant to EPCC (Mar 2022)

Marathon Petroleum Corporation Foundation presented a \$273,838 check to the Foundation for El Paso Community College at a press conference held at EPCC's Advanced Technology Center at the Valle Verde Campus. This funding is for a grant that will be used to create the Marathon Petroleum Corporation High School to College Transition Program in Welding Technology which is designed to address the regional need for trained, qualified, and certified welders. This new initiative is a collaboration between EPCC, the Ysleta ISD Career Center Welding Program at Riverside High School, and Marathon Petroleum Corporation. This program will provide students a clear pathway to transition from Ysleta ISD's Riverside High School's welding program to El Paso Community College where they are able to earn additional welding certifications or an associate's degree.







Total Hispanic Population as of July 1, 2022









Percent of Persons 25 and Older with an Associate's, Bachelor's, or Graduate/Professional Degree, 2017-2021











Enrollment of Students at Each Location, Fall 2022





Enrollment by Student Type, Fall 2022





Enrollment by Students Receiving Any Financial Aid, Fall 2022









Top 10 Majors of First-Time in College Students, Fall 2022







Dual Credit Enrollment by Ethnicity, Fall 2022



Early College High School Enrollment by Gender, Fall 2022











Continuing Education Enrollment by Ethnicity, Quarter 1, Fall 2022



GLOSSARY

Cohort: A group of individuals who meet a set of criteria (e.g., a group of students who register during the same semester or begin attending college for the first time at the same time).

Developmental Student: A student who takes a developmental course during his or her first semester in college (State definition). This designation is permanent with respect to the student's State record.

Face-to-Face Course: The traditional delivery method in which a course is taught in a face-to-face setting with an instructor.

Fall-to-Fall Retention: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following fall semester.

Fall-to-Spring Persistence: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following spring semester.

First-Time In College (FTIC) Student: A student in his or her first semester of college attendance, who has never attended any college previously.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE): The total number of student credit hours divided by 15 for the Fall term (or for one semester only) and is divided by 30 for the entire academic or fiscal year.

Full-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 12 or more credit hours during any semester.

Internet Course: A type of delivery method in which a course is taught online and allows students access to course materials 24 hours a day. Faculty post materials, instructions, readings and assignments online for students to complete on their own or in a group.

Part-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 11 credit hours or less during any semester.

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB): This agency was created by the Texas Legislature and provides leadership and coordination for the Texas higher education system and works with the legislature, governor, governing boards, higher education institutions and other entities to help promote access to quality higher education across Texas.

Unduplicated Enrollment: The number of students registered during a specified period of time.

V2022: aka Vintage Year 2022. The final year of data produced in a time series of estimates of population that begins with the most recent decennial U.S. Census data and extends to the "Vintage Year." V2022 is the most current year of population estimates available as of July 1, 2023.
