EPCC Sets the Gold Standard for Work with Military Students

El Paso Community College (EPCC) was recognized with a 2023-2024 Military Friendly® School Gold designation by VIQTORY. Now in its 13th year, the Military Friendly® Schools list has come to set the standard for higher education institutions to provide the best opportunities for veterans and their spouses.

EPCC Early College Grad Now UTEP's Youngest Grad

Andrea Hernandez is the youngest in her cohort receiving a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree at the University of Texas (UTEP). At 19, she is the pride of EPCC, graduating in the inaugural class at Americas High School's Trailblazers Early College High School (ECHS) in 2019. She received her associate's degree from EPCC in 2021 before transferring to the UTEP Nursing program. She has been hired at the Hospitals of Providence as a registered nurse once she passes the NCLEX State Board of Nursing exam.

EPCC Chemistry Honored with 2022 Compass Award

EPCC's Chemistry discipline was awarded the Compass Award by the Student Learning Outcomes (SLO) Office as a recognition of outstanding efforts by a program/discipline to enhance student learning through intentional assessment design. The award was presented by the EPCC SLO office, and was selected by EPCC faculty.

Philosophy Student Tops in State

EPCC student Jesus Guerrero, former president of the EPCC Philosophy Club, won first place in Pathophysiology at the Texas Health Occupations Student of America (HOSA) competition. He competed against all the top universities in Texas representing Texas Tech's Health and Science Center El Paso. Mr. Guerrero obtained his Bachelor's degree in Biology at Sul Ross State University and is about to finish his Associate's in Philosophy at EPCC.

Dr. William Serrata Receives Citizens of the Year Honors

EPCC president Dr. William Serrata received the 2022 Citizen of the Year Award from the Military Order of World Wars (MOWW) El Paso Chapter. The award was presented by MOWW past-president Jesus Beltran and current president David Thackston. Dr. Serrata was recognized for his leadership in the community and support of the military, veterans and their families. The MOWW Greater El Paso Chapter honored Dr. Serrata's efforts to make a measurable impact at EPCC and in our community as well as his commitment to advancing post-secondary education locally, regionally, and nationally.

EPCC ACCOLADES AND AWARDS, CONTINUED

James Beard Award Finalist Gained Culinary Skills at EPCC

Emiliano Marentes, former EPCC Culinary Arts student and twice James Beard-nominated chef, was a finalist in this year's competition, which is one of the most coveted and acclaimed recognitions in the industry. Marentes has earned acclaim for his love of corn tortillas and his commitment to traditional methods for preparing them. He owns and is a chef at restaurant 'Elemi' in downtown El Paso.

EPCC Receives Decennial Reaffirmation of Accreditation

EPCC is proud to have received reaffirmation of accreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). The process assesses all aspects of the College, including academic programs, student services, and finances. All institutions accredited by SACSCOC are required to undergo a comprehensive and rigorous review every 10 years and is required for students to be eligible for federal student aid and for EPCC to offer degree-granting programs.

EPCC Students Receive Prestigious S-STEM Scholarship

Five students from EPCC have been awarded the prestigious National Science Foundation S-STEM Scholarship. Ayat Adams, Fernando Munoz, Emiliano Garcia, Ivan Alonso, and Mayrin Amelie Rivera Garcia will transition to computer science at UTEP. This scholarship covers tuition expenses, along with a comprehensive array of opportunities. These opportunities include access to professional development programs, participation in events like the Great Minds in STEM (GMIS) conference in Pasadena, California, involvement in student competitions such as hackathons and data-thons, and Google-sponsored professional development activities, among others that will focus on cybersecurity and data analysis.

EPCC Receives \$350,000 NSF Grant

EPCC received a 3-year Advanced Technological Education (ATE) grant in the amount of \$350,000 from the National Science Foundation (NSF), the U.S. Government's independent science agency. The grant will fund EPCC's Developing Computational Adversarial Thinking: Bridging Technical Skills Training & Academic Coursework program. The project runs from 2023-2026, and the implementation will take place at EPCC in several locations of the Arts Science and Technology building at the Valle Verde Campus and will provide student opportunities to prepare for careers in high-tech fields.

Two Tejanos Sign to Play for NCAA Division 1 Baseball

Two EPCC student-athletes signed National Letters of Intent to play for NCAA Division 1 baseball programs. Once completing their final season and graduating from EPCC, Isaiah Gonzalez and Edwin Sanchez will continue their education and athletics at Division 1 universities. Isaiah Gonzalez has signed with the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley in Edinburg, Texas, while Edwin Sanchez will be attending Bethune-Cookman in Daytona Beach, Florida.





EPCC Faculty by Full and Part-Time Status and Gender, Fall 2023




Faculty by Race/Ethnicity, Fall 2023











Per Capita Income (in 2022 dollars), 2018-2022
















Enrollment of Students at Each Location, Fall 2023



Dual Credit, Early College H.S., P-TECH and Distance Learning Enrollments, Fall 2023




Enrollment by Students Receiving Any Financial Aid, Fall 2023


















Continuing Education Enrollment by Ethnicity, Quarter 1, Fall 2023

Continuing Education Enrollment by Ethnicity, Quarter 1, Fall 2023



GLOSSARY

Cohort: A group of individuals who meet a set of criteria (e.g., a group of students who register during the same semester or begin attending college for the first time at the same time).

Developmental Student: A student who takes a developmental course during his or her first semester in college (State definition). This designation is permanent with respect to the student's State record.

Face-to-Face Course: The traditional delivery method in which a course is taught in a face-to-face setting with an instructor.

Fall-to-Fall Retention: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following fall semester.

Fall-to-Spring Persistence: The percentage or number of students who register in the fall semester during a specified period of time and who register again the following spring semester.

First-Time In College (FTIC) Student: A student in his or her first semester of college attendance, who has never attended any college previously.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE): The total number of student credit hours divided by 15 for the Fall term (or for one semester only) and is divided by 30 for the entire academic or fiscal year.

Full-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 12 or more credit hours during any semester.

Internet Course: A type of delivery method in which a course is taught online and allows students access to course materials 24 hours a day. Faculty post materials, instructions, readings and assignments online for students to complete on their own or in a group.

Part-Time Student: Any student who is registered for 11 credit hours or less during any semester.

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB): This agency was created by the Texas Legislature and provides leadership and coordination for the Texas higher education system and works with the legislature, governor, governing boards, higher education institutions and other entities to help promote access to quality higher education across Texas.

Unduplicated Enrollment: The number of students registered during a specified period of time.

V2023: aka Vintage Year 2023. The final year of data produced in a time series of estimates of population that begins with the most recent decennial U.S. Census data and extends to the "Vintage Year." V2023 is the most current year of population estimates available as of July 1, 2024.
