

ARP Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund

Quarterly Fund Report - April 5, 2022

 An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the ARPA Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

El Paso Community College (EPCC) signed a Certification and Agreement with the U.S. Department of Education to receive additional funds appropriated under Section 18004(a) (1) of the CARES Act Section 314(a)(1) of the American Rescue Plan Act, 2021 (ARPA).

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

EPCC received \$38,810,325.00 from the U.S. Department of Students for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter).

As of April 5, 2022; \$49,810,990.00 of Emergency Aid Grant funds have been distributed to eligible students.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution who are or could be eligible to participate in the Federal student financial aid programs under Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and thus are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

As of April 5, 2022, 23,031 students have received an ARPA Emergency Financial Aid Grant.

An online application is available for students to apply. Eligible students received grants up to \$1,500.00 per eligible semester.

EPCC has provided a variety of outreach to support students and notify them of the availability of Emergency Financial Aid Grants from the ARPA. Students enrolled for the fall semester were called, texted, emailed directly by EPCC, and it was promoted on the college's social media channels. Students were instructed to visit the College's ARPA webpage to obtain more information about eligibility.
